CWBA UPDATE JULY 2017

The CWBA manage declared pests currently prioritising on wild dogs, foxes and rabbits. There are bait racks twice yearly as well as rabbit bait mix days once per year.

The CWBA have two Licenced Pest Management Technicians but stock attacks unfortunately continue; since January we have had 123 stock losses, 8 wild dogs destroyed and a number of sightings. This in an ongoing effort and we need a community, wide spread approach.

The CWBA are working hard behind the scenes to ensure effective management continues, the CWBA have formed operational plans and budgets and have recently welcomed the Morawa Shire on board after a successful community survey.

We have had an improved CWBA Constitution approved by the Department of Commerce to streamline the document process as well as keeping up to date with legislation changes.
